

Believe & Receive Your Healing

The Bible states we must “believe and receive” our divine healing!

1. Jesus already provided our healing on the cross ~2,000 years ago; and therefore, we don't need to ask, hope, or beg him for it. Instead, we are told to simply "believe & receive" our healing. [NOTE: This is also the same biblical process for receiving our salvation (forgiveness of our sins).]
2. We take our healing via our “faith-filled” words, which is a combination of our heart (believing) and mouth (receiving).
3. Jesus essentially instructed us to “receive” or “take” our divine healing by speaking to our sickness (e.g., “cancer, leave my body in the name of Jesus!”), speaking/confessing God's truth that we believe (e.g., “Jesus bore all my sicknesses and by his stripes I was healed!”), and believing in our hearts that we have received/taken our healing.
4. Faith “takes” the healing immediately (spiritually), while patience “keeps” the healing until full manifestation (physically).
5. Healing can be manifested immediately, but it is often gradual (although it always begins the moment we “received” or “took” our healing).
6. The Bible analogizes our problems in life (e.g., sickness, pain, etc.) as “spiritual mountains.”

Mark 11:23-24

“ Truly I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, ‘Go, throw yourself into the sea,’ and does not doubt in their heart but believes that what they say will happen, it will be done for them. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, **believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.**”

Matthew 17:20

“ Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, **you can say to this mountain, ‘Move from here to there,’ and it will move.** Nothing will be impossible for you.”

2 Corinthians 4:13

“ It is written: “**I believed; therefore I have spoken.**” Since we have that same spirit of faith, **we also believe and therefore speak.**”

Romans 10:9-10

“ If you **declare with your mouth,** “Jesus is Lord,” and **believe in your heart** that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your **heart that you believe** and are justified, and it is with your **mouth that you profess your faith** and are saved.”

“ We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through **faith and patience** inherit what has been promised.”

“ Surely **He took on our infirmities** and carried our sorrows; yet we considered Him stricken by God, struck down and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and **by His stripes we are healed.**”

“ Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;).”
